

Michigan Radiological Society Resident & Fellow Section Application for Executive Board Position

Prior to the yearly Michigan Radiological Society Resident and Fellows Conference, candidates will be asked to complete an application which will be anonymized. Each application will receive a numerical score (1-10) ranked by select members of the resident affairs committee. The average score will be utilized to rank candidates. The highest-ranking applicant from each program (which applied) will have the "first-choice" in position. The second-highest ranking applicant from each program will have the "second-choice" in position, and so forth. If an applicant's first-choice position has already been filled, they will fill their next choice position until no other positions are available. A second position may not be filled by a member of the same residency program until all residency programs are represented. If there is a tie in applicant score, the chair of the resident affairs committee will make the tie-breaking decision. All winners will be announced at the yearly Michigan Radiological Society Resident and Fellows Conference.

What ideas do you have for MRS RFS this year?

I hope to contribute to MRS RFS by expanding the role it plays in medical student mentorship and education. Specifically, this could be accomplished by providing resources to interested students (research opportunities, basic radiology-related learning materials, one-on-one mentoring opportunities), as well as holding events throughout the year at various medical schools (panels, conferences meet & greets, etc.) that allow students to become familiar with the field. I also think that MRS RFS could expand its role in the community through specific volunteering/outreach events. This could include partnership with both medical organizations (e.g. medical education within the community, health fairs, etc.) and non-medical organizations. Lastly, I think MRS RFS could compile a more extensive list of resources for its members, as well as hold occasional social events (given improvements in COVID) to allow members from programs across Michigan to network and meet.
